Thanks very much for supporting our Nine Edge Endurance fundraising event in 2025, your support and generosity is very much appreciated by everyone at Edale Mountain Rescue Team. I hope you all had a good day and have recovered from your exertions.

Looking out of the window a week on from the event I think we can all be grateful the event took place last Saturday, it is very wet here in the Peak District.

The fell race results have now been posted on the Fell Runners Association website, www.fellrunner.org.uk, and the running, walking and climbing results have been posted on our website, https://edalemrt.co.uk/nine-edges/, along with the list of awards and the results in the V60 category, which didn't feature in our race but is on the FRA results listing.

Congratulations to all of you who participated in your personal challenge be it climbing, walking or running. 11 people took on the climbing challenge, 76 people took on the walking challenge and 178 started the fell race. Very nearly everyone who started finished, one runner retired at checkpoint 3 and four walkers retired at checkpoint 6 as time was against them.

Thanks to the participant who handed a yellow windproof jacket in at the finish and to the staff at the Robin Hood, who handed us a bag with one runner's complete race kit when we left on Saturday evening. Both these items have now been returned to their grateful owners. We still have a Buff neck collar and a baseball cap looking for owners. But don't have the Buff one participant reported losing or the item of clothing believed to have been lost in the car park at the finish. Labelled items left in the baggage reclaim tent have also been returned, fortunately all the abandoned items were labelled with race numbers, so there is nothing outstanding from baggage reclaim. A happy owner also managed to retrieve a mobile phone left on one of the buses, thanks to the bus driver for making that happen.

There were no call outs in our patch on the day, which made life much easier for the rescue team volunteers and no serious injuries to participants on the event, although several of you finished with bloody knees after taking a tumble.
